Qualification Overview

This qualification reflects the role of an individual working as a senior civil works designer or a paraprofessional designer, who supports professional engineers. They perform tasks that are broad, specialised, complex and technical and include strategic areas and initiating activities. They are responsible for the design of complex projects to ensure the implementation of the client's site requirements and are required to demonstrate self-directed application of theoretical and technical knowledge and initiate solutions to technical problems or management requirements.

Licensing, legislative, regulatory and certification requirements that apply to this qualification can vary between states, territories, and industry sectors.

Possible job titles relevant to this qualification include:

Civil Construction Supervisor

Civil Engineering Draftsperson

Senior Civil Construction Designer

Pre-Requisites: There are no pre-requisites for this qualification.

Entry Requirements:

- o The applicant must be 18-year-old or over.
- o The applicant must be Australian/New Zealand citizen or permanent Australian resident.
- o The applicant needs to have either successfully finished Australian Year 12 or an equivalent level of education, or hold a Certificate IV or a higher qualification from an Australian educational institution.
- o The applicant must be must complete literacy and numeracy test and the pre-training review. Applicant will be assessed for suitability through a pre-training review. As a

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result of the pre-training review, any applicant with identified barriers will be referred to the appropriate support services/office or referred externally where required.

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- o Applicant should have basic knowledge of computer including MS Office skills (Word, Excel, and Power Point).
